Information on Undergraduate Pilot Training Board 2013

Thanks for your interest in the South Carolina Air National Guard. We have a long proud tradition of single seat, single engine fighter aviation. Steps in the application process are listed below as well as contact info. We look forward to receiving your application and meeting you. Thanks again.

1. Applications will be accepted from 1 Mar to 1 Apr for a May board tentatively planned for Sat 4 May 2013. Info in the application package should be current as of 15 Feb or later.
2. Once we review the packages, we select approximately 15 candidates for an interview.
3. The Interview Board meets on Sat of drill weekend to interview and select one candidate. Candidates will be notified of the board results by e-mail three weeks after the board.
4. The following documents are required in each application package:
 - a. Consolidated college transcript
 - b. Resume including e-mail address
 - c. Air Force Form 24 Application for Appointment as Reserve of the Air Force
 - d. Air Force Officer Qualifying Test (AFOQT) Scores
 - e. PCSM Score Sheet (combines flying hours, AFOQT pilot score and Test of Basic Aviation Skills (TBAS) scores), see this website for schedule:

 - f. Cover Letter
 - g. Letters of Recommendation (optional)
 - h. Picture (recommended to associate faces with names)
 - i. Copies of pilot logbook totals, pilot certificate, FAA medical, etc. if applicable
 - j. Other items as desired to present yourself or make your case
5. Per AFI36-2005 and ANGI36-2005 (<http://www.e-publishing.af.mil/>) minimum AFOQT scores and Grade Point Averages (GPA) to qualify are:
 - a. With a 4-year degree: Verbal 15, Pilot 25, Quantitative 10, Navigator 10, and pilot + navigator at least 50; no minimum GPA
 - b. Without a 4-year degree: You must have 90 semester hours minimum, Verbal 30, Pilot 50, Quantitative 25, Navigator 25, and Pilot + Nav at least 90; Minimum GPA: 90-104 semester hours = 2.3, 105-119 hours = 2.2, 120 or more = 2.1These are the minimums, applicants typically have much higher scores.
6. Overall, we are looking for two things in a combat fighter pilot candidate. One, someone who we believe can make it through the two years of rigorous training. Two, someone we can live with for twenty years. Your job is to convince us of both.
7. You are welcome to visit the unit before the board. Drill weekends are best. Call Col Meyer or MSgt Sewell to arrange.
