#### **Foreword**

It contains summary figures from Fiscal Year 2022. (Oct. 1, 2021 - Sept. 30, 2022).



#### **Description of Capital Asset**

Home for both Air and Army National Guard aircraft and training facilities, McEntire JNGB operates the most advanced multi-role F-16 Fighting Falcons fighter jets in the United States Air Force inventory alongside, AH-64E Apache Guardian attack helicopters and UH-60L Black Hawk support helicopters.

#### **Mission Statement**

McEntire Joint National Guard Base (JNGB) is the home to the two flagship major commands of the South Carolina National Guard and serves over 4,000 Citizen Soldiers, Airmen and state employees. The base's 2,389 acres are routinely utilized by a variety of special operations units and law enforcement organizations. In times of emergency, McEntire JNGB becomes the aviation hub for state and federal disaster response.

The "Swamp Foxes" of the 169th Fighter Wing, the South Carolina Air National Guard's primary unit, provide world class air power in the nation's time of need. The wing's primary mission is Suppression and Destruction of Enemy Air Defenses (SEAD/DEAD), utilizing 28 of the most capable variant of the F-16 in the United States Air Force inventory. The wing is also tasked as an Aerospace Control Alert trained unit and is ready to launch at a moment's notice around-the-clock, 365-days a year to defend the Southeast Continental United States.

The South Carolina Army National Guard's (SCARNG) 59th Aviation Troop Command bases 24 AH-64E Apache Guardians of the 1-151st Attack Reconnaissance Battalion and 11 UH-60L Black Hawks of the 2-151st Security and Support Aviation Battalion at McEntire JNGB. These premier aviation units enable unparalleled combined arms combat power.

A Combined Support Maintenance Shop provides field and sustainment maintenance for light and heavy tracked and wheeled vehicles which support more than 10,000 National Guard Soldiers state-wide, and nine SCARNG units utilize the Joint Armed Forces Reserve Center for monthly drills and annual training.

The personnel of McEntire JNGB are uniquely suited to promote mutual interests with the Republic of Colombia through the National Guard's State Partnership Program (SPP). Since its inception in 2012, more than 100 cooperative efforts have been conducted to assist the transition of the Colombian military from a wartime to peacetime posture while facing increasing regional threats.
